**Power of the Purse raises over \$425,000 for The Women's Fund Miami-Dade
Sold out luncheon celebrates the work of Ruth Shack for her visionary leadership**

MIAMI, Florida – The Women's Fund Miami-Dade's signature 2015 **Power of the Purse** Luncheon and Auction held at the Hilton Miami Downtown on lucky Friday, March 13th raised over \$425,000 for the women and girls served in Miami-Dade County. Businesswoman, fashion icon and Master of Ceremonies Elle Macpherson led a lively and emotional program showcasing the work of this 22-year-old organization to a sold out audience of 1,000 South Florida leaders, philanthropists and government officials.
