
Women in Miami-Dade County

Economic Opportunity


In 2018, 67.7% of women in Miami-Dade County worked full-time, a 0.6% increase from 2017. Overall, the percentage of women who worked full-time in MDC is larger than in Florida (62.8%) and the U.S. (61.1%).

Labor Force Participation by Age (2018)






Median Earnings and Earnings Gaps




Income Disparities for Female Workers by Race (2018)

White, non-Hispanic full-time female workers earned 40.6% more than Black workers and 41.1% more than Hispanic workers.



Earnings Gaps by Occupation among the 10 Highest Earning Professions (2018)

Despite the wage growth in all ten top earning occupations for women, the wage gap still persists in nine of the ten. Moreover, the gaps are typically largest in the highest earning occupations.
